Consider this wonderful opportunity as one of your unforgettable life experiences...

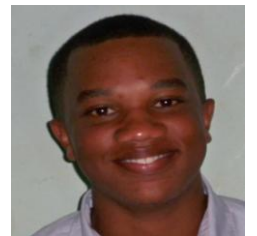
